

Israel to Sell Armored Vehicles to US



AL-QUDS, Feb. 27--An Israeli occupation firm is to sell the US 60 armored vehicles for use by its troops in Iraq, a report said Tuesday.

The Golan vehicles, produced by the Rafael firm, are valued at \$37 million and will be delivered within three months, the Army radio said.

The 15-ton armored vehicle is designed to transport 10 soldiers and their equipment. It was first unveiled in September 2006 and four months later the US army ordered 60 of the vehicles, which are not yet used by Israeli forces.

The Golan is fitted with a "floating floor" to reduce the effects of exploding mines and is "particularly adapted to operations in densely populated urban zones", according to its manufacturer.

Zionist arms producers are already providing US troops in Iraq with drones, rockets and armor for tanks and armored personnel carriers.
